FOCUS AREA 2: HIGHER EDUCATION PARTNERSHIPS

DATA TO SUPPORT NEED: 25% OF TEACHERS IN TEXAS ARE BEING TRAINED BY A SINGLE ALTERNATIVE CERTIFICATION PROVIDER IN A PROGRAM THAT TAKES 6 - 8 WEEKS. TARRANT COUNTY DISTRICT HR DIRECTORS SAY THAT THE QUALITY OF TEACHERS PREPARED BY A 6-8 WEEK ALTERNATIVE CERTIFICATION PROGRAM IS "INSUFFICIENT" IN MEETING THE COMPETENCIES FOR THE ROLE.

IMPACT TO SYSTEM: CURRENTLY, 71% OF TARRANT COUNTY DISTRICTS HAVE FORMAL PARTNERSHIPS WITH HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS, YET 63% SAY THEY ASPIRE TO PARTNER WITH HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS. WITH 35,200 EDUCATOR POSITIONS IN TARRANT COUNTY, COLLECTIVELY, THESE DISTRICTS ARE THE LARGEST REGIONAL EMPLOYER GIVING THEM COLLECTIVE BARGAINING POWER TO INFLUENCE HOW SCHOOLS OF EDUCATION PREPARE THE FUTURE WORKFORCE.
